Upcoming NYS ELA and Math Tests

As it is stated in our school handbook, our students "take part in the Archdiocesan testing program, which includes the Archdiocesan Religion test, Annual Standardized Tests, and New York State Education Department assessments. These tests measure academic growth over a period of time." Our Archdiocesan Catholic Schools have always aligned our curriculum with national standards, rather than just a recent transition to Common Core.

On Tuesday, March 28 to Thursday, March 30th our students in Grades 3-8 will be taking the NYS ELA Tests. These assessments provide us with valuable information to help us to continue to meet the learning needs of our students. *Please be sure that your children are in school on time on these days.* The tests will take place in the morning. PLEASE NOTE that the Archdiocese and SDSC will not be honoring an OPT OUT option for these tests this year. Included below are some important points about test-taking:

- Test-taking helps build mental stamina in children, preparing them for higher education.
- Data gleaned from state exams helps teachers create individualized instruction and provide support in specific areas as needed.
- State exam scores do not determine promotion or retention.
- Elementary-level state exams prepare students for future "standardized testing" such as the high school TACHS exam, SATs, ACTs, driver's licenses, GREs, Bar exams and more.
- To ensure exams contain relevant and constructive content, teachers have vetted and edited this year's questions.
- Performance and personal data is carefully protected by the school and state, and is not shared with outside vendors or organizations.

- 1. *The National Anthem* groups of five voices (minimum) or more are invited to compete to sing the National Anthem at the beginning of the game
- 2. *God Bless America* soloists ONLY are invited to compete to sing God Bless America during the 7th inning stretch.
- 3. *Take Me Out To The Ball Game* groups of five voices (minimum) or more are invited to compete to sing right after "God Bless America."

Each school will have its own contest and then may enter ONE group and/or ONE soloist in EACH contest.
