Monday

Science Explorers



In this program students will explore science with a different fun topic each week. They will experiment with magnets and have a "hair-raising" experience while learning about electricity. They will play tricks on their senses by experimenting with their taste buds and manipulating sound waves. Students will investigate light waves, explore the properties of color, and then baffle their eyes with optical illusions. They will also analyze the amazing properties of polymers and make


slime. Take home projects include a periscope, an electric Newtonian color wheel, floating magnets, a static electricity stick, a color-changing "heat sheet", slime and more!
