Choice Based Art is now here at SDSC! Students are treated like artists. They plan original works of art and choose art media and techniques that will help communicate their ideas. This curriculum is also known as TAB (Teaching for Artistic Behavior).

What does Choice Based Art look like?

- Students participate in mini lessons about media techniques, subject matter, the artistic process, elements and principles of art, and art history/styles.
- Students assume the role of an artist and use a Planning Sheet to show their thinking before creating works of art inspired by their own interests and passions.
- Students move between art centers and choose media that best communicates their ideas.
- Each class ends with "Share Time". An artist displays their work and describes their subject and medium. Members of the class ask questions or make comments using art vocabulary.
- Each student reflects on their original work of art by writing an Artist Statement describing their artistic process.

How will my child benefit fro Choice Based Art? Students will:

- Observe the world around them
- Seek inspiration and answers to questions through research
- · Experiment and explore
- Be open to new ideas
- · Collaborate with others
- Learn to be flexible and work through mistakes
- · Express their ideas in innovative ways
- · Reflect on their work and the work of others
- · Connect to other disciplines through art making
- · Value the work and ideas of others
- As with everything, practicing art develops your ability as an artist. Please encourage your student to draw during their down time. It's a great alternative to video games and allows students to feel a sense of peace.

Weekly sketch Homework:

- · Only for grades 6-8

- Sketch is written on the board, so if
 a child is absent, they can check the board
 upon their return or ask a classmate or myself.
- A zero is given if child is not prepared for sketch review.
